Seminar Description:

Laboratories with their intense use of outside air and safety concerns are one of the most challenging building types to achieve net zero. In fact, some might say it can't be done at least for many climates. However, a path does exist to achieve net zero energy or at least near net zero using multiple technologies such as VAV lab and exhaust fan control, demand based control of ACH's, chilled beams or hydronic cooling, and heat recovery. This seminar will explore this topic from a holistic viewpoint and provide a detailed review of an actual case study of a large near net zero lab project in Abu Dhabi, UAE..

Message from Membership Promotion

I recently attended an ASHRAE training session in Denver and learned more about members advancing from Associates to full Members that I thought I'd share for this month's Newsletter.

First of all, here's what I already knew, and many of you may too:

- There are only three Types of Memberships: Students, Associates and Members
- There are two Membership Status levels: Active and Grace (= Member's dues are over 3 months late)
- There are seven "Print" Grades: Students, Affiliates, Associates, Members, Retired, Life and Fellows. These different grades apply primarily to how much a member pays for membership and what level of benefits they receive. For example, Life Members no longer pay annual dues; Affiliates don't receive the Handbooks. The vast majority of us are Associates & (Full) Members.
- To hold any officer position or any positions on the Regional or Society levels, one must be a Member.
- If you are an Associate with education, professional licensure or work experience of 12 years or more, you are eligible to upgrade to a full member. Looking at our roster, there are 93 members who might be able to upgrade to Members.

Now here's what either I didn't know, or was a little on the fuzzy side about, *Despite* being the Membership Chair for a Year!

- Read that last bullet one more time. Yeah, you probably missed it too. Key phrase: "With education.... of 12 years or more." I thought that meant 12 years as an engineer! Not so. Education beyond high school counts as part of the 12 years.
- Additionally, graduates of accredited colleges get 1-1/2 years counted for every year of education.
- For Non-college graduates or Graduates of a non-accredited college, they count 1 year of education as 1 year.
- If you have your P.E. License, they credit you with 3 additional years.

So look at your professional value one more time. Are you eligible to Advance? A BS grad from an accredited college with their P.E. and four years of post-college experience is eligible! Additionally, I thought, well if I'm comfy in my current job and have no intention of serving on a Tech Committee, Standing Committee or as an Officer or on any Regional or Societal Level of ASHRAE, what do I care what type of Membership I have? Well, if adding another asset to your professional resume isn't a priority now, realize this: To serve on any of those upper-level positions requires **3-5 years as a full member** before you are eligible. So even if you don't desire it today, that could change down the line, especially if you lose your job or your employer wants some influence on Standards or increased marketing exposure.

For more information on what experience qualifies for advancement, please see Section 2.7 of the <u>ASHRAE Bylaws</u>.

So how do you Advance to Member? Update your ASHRAE bio online, and notify <u>member-ship@ashrae.org</u> that you have an updated bio and wish to be considered for grade advancement. Copy your local Membership Chair (Liesl Hammer this year) on that email also, so the NE Chapter is notified and can make sure it doesn't get lost in the shuffle. Questions? The year was 1976 - 77 and the Northeastern New York Chapter President was Clifford H. Vickery.

The Annual Steak Roast was held September 20, 1976 at the Bavarian Chalet on Route 20 in Guilderland with Golf at the Colonie Town Golf Course. Chair for the event was Bob Peck, Jr. Dinner meetings were held at Sleasman's Hofbrau in Latham. On April 30, 1977 the Annual Banquet & Casino Night was held at Michael's Restaurant in Latham. The night included Casino games, cocktail hour, full course Prime Rib dinner and dancing to music of the Galaxy Quartet.

Loran Appleby, a member of the chapter was serving as Chairman of the Long Range Planning Committee of the Society. This was the first chapter member to be appointed to a very important committee at Society.

A Chapter dues of \$10 per year was initiated.

Larry Pedersen was the Finance Chairman.

And that is the way it was in 1976 - 77.
